If you do not file objections to the motion with the court and serve them on the defendant within 14 days from the mailing of this motion, the motion will be granted without further hearing. Certificate of Mailing

The principal defendant is responsible for serving the motion when the motion is filed in the circuit court. The clerk of the court is responsible for serving the motion when the motion is filed in the district court. The motion is not served on the garnishee defendant.

Objections

Objections from the plaintiff must be filed with the court within 14 days from the mailing of this petition. If objections are filed, the court will decide the motion based on the papers filed or will notify the parties that a hearing will be required. Unless the court schedules the hearing, the defendant is responsible for noticing the motion for hearing.

Notice of Hearing

Unless the court schedules the hearing, the defendant is responsible for noticing the motion for hearing.

Order

If the court grants installment payments (SCAO Approved Form MC 15a, Order Regarding Installment Payments), the principal defendant is responsible for sending a copy of the order to the plaintiff. If a writ of garnishment was already issued and the principal defendant's employer is currently withholding funds from earnings, the principal defendant will also need to send a copy of the order to his/her employer (also known as the garnishee defendant). Otherwise, his/her employer will continue to withhold funds.
